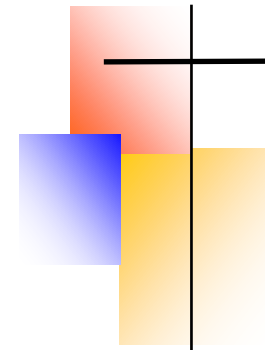

Our Saviour Comes

Advent is a steady progression that moves us towards Christmas day. We begin by being mindful of the promise that the Lord would come to deliver his people and to judge sin. We remember the promise that the sign of this coming would be the arrival of the messenger, one like the prophet Elijah calling the people to repent and to make the changes before God. That coming will be a time of great joy and of peace for all who look to God.

On this last Sunday of Advent we look at the promise God made that the focal point of his coming, the content of his messenger's proclamation is the arrival of the Messiah, the long promised descendent of David. One day from Bethlehem, a small country town so to speak, will come Israel's saviour who will rescue God's people. The gospels tell us that Jesus is that promised saviour and he came to save Israel not from Roman occupation but from their sins and to deliver them from the powers of darkness and evil. The light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not overcome it (John 1:5).

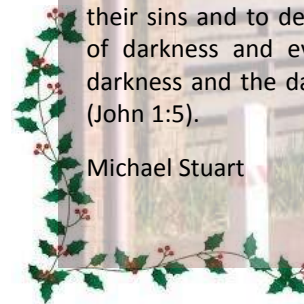
