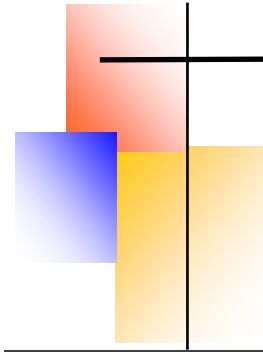

Old Church — New Life

Born: August (?) 1512 Blackfriars, London, England

Died: 5 September 1548 Sudeley Castle,
Gloucestershire, England

Manner of death: Childbed Fever, 6 days after giving
birth to a daughter.

Spouses: Sir Edward Burgh; John Neville; King Henry
VIII; Thomas Seymour

Significant Contributions: Prayers or Meditations;
Lamentations of a Sinner.

Catherine Parr was born of a noble English family and her father Thomas Parr was a companion of Henry VIII. His first wife was also her godmother. She was a passionate learner who spoke five languages. She married Sir Thomas Burgh, who died, then John Neville the Baron of Latimer. After his death she eventually joined Mary Tudor's household then married King Henry. She was a substantial spiritual influence on his children as their stepmother. Over the years she had become protestant in her religious views given the appalling treatment of her second husband by rebels. After Henry died she married Thomas Seymour, Baron of Sudeley, and died not long after giving birth to Margaret. She wrote two books on prayer and faith amongst other things. Over the centuries many historians have recognised her courage, compassion, faith and loyalty as well as her at time brutal honesty and strong will as she served her Lord.
