Resisting Evil

As our series on 1 Peter comes to a close the last chapter in part reminds Peter's readers and us that the greater power at work against Christians is the devil, the evil one. All in all the bible ascribes to him four main methods by which he works. He is the deceiver, the tempter, the accuser and the destroyer. He seeks to twist and distort if not destroy all that is good and godly, including God's people.

CS Lewis reminds us though we must be careful. We either err on giving the devil too much attention or none at all. The apostles remind us of his reality and power but they also remind us that the Lord Jesus Christ is far stronger having vanquished his power in the life of Christians especially.

Peter also reminds us that one of the reasons the New Testament writers make much about godliness and godly behavior, of avowing various sins and attitudes is that they can only end up becoming the means by which the devil tempts us. He delights in preying on our fears, inciting our anger, deepening our despair and exacerbating our pride. Humility is easier said than done but through it we keep our eyes on Christ and find ourselves in a stronger position in the face of suffering and evil as we serve the Lord.

It was with much sadness that we farewelled Lizzie McKerlie on Monday. Lizzie had been a regular at KAC for many years through her childhood and teenage years until she was placed in care at Nilsen. She was severely disabled due to the many seizures she had, sometimes several in a day, but when she was well she had a smile for those around her. Her parents Perry and Ann, and her sister Rebecca were devoted to her. I recall Perry speaking to us about how much love Lizzie had brought to their family and how much richer their lives were because Lizzie was part of their family.

My daughter, Ashley, spent many a sleepover at the McKerlie's with Rebecca painting Lizzie's nails and doing her hair. Lizzie loved to look pretty, she was a very girly girl. As Perry said she was a princess and she knew it and she expected to look the part.

I recall one Sunday service when Lizzie's chair was parked in front of us. Nathan was sitting behind Lizzie. She knew there was someone behind her and she strained to see who was there. Eventually she stretched out her hand behind her and Nathan held it. She was contented with that and they spent the service continuing to hold hands.

There were times when Lizzie was ill or uncomfortable and it was heart wrenching to hear her groaning with her discomfort and pain. There is no hurt for her now. She is free from pain.

Our sympathy and love go out to Perry, Ann, Michael and Rebecca for their loss. We ask the Lord to heal their pain, comfort and strengthen them and give them His peace.
