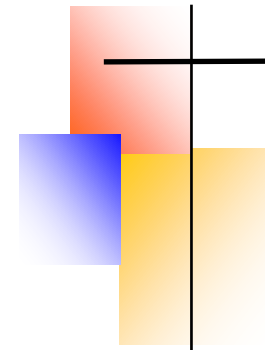

The Lord is in the Detail

Today we're looking at four Psalms that form part of a collection that are read around Christmas and in Lent. One of the cluster speaks of God's overwhelming presence and knowledge, most especially His intimate knowledge of us from the moment of our conception. It's a Psalm that reminds us that, though we may not feel this is the case, God is very aware of our complexity, our frailty, and our formation in every detail. Any Doctor or scientist in the field of medicine can tell you of the incredible complexity of the body and its parts thereof. In our struggles He is there and the wonder of Christmas is that in Jesus He embraces our humanity in order to ultimately restore and fulfill it.

In our society books on good eating, self-help and healthy living abound but in the long term upon our Lord's return, the glory that is his incarnate and resurrected body will also be ours and then, in every way, suffering, illness and death will be faint memories.
