

Old Church — New Life

29th October 2017

Martin Luther

Born: 10 November 1483, [Eisleben, Saxony](#)

Died: 18 February 1546, Eisleben, Saxony

Manner of death: A stroke after many years of illness.

Spouse: Katharina Von Bora (A former nun)

Significant Contributions: 95 Theses; Luther's Large and Small Catechism; On the Bondage of the Will; On the Freedom of a Christian.

Martin Luther was born to Hans and Margarethe Luder and was part of a large family. He studied at the University of Erfurt, beginning with Law then Philosophy. He dramatically decided to join St Augustine's monastery in Erfurt in 1505. He gained a doctorate in philosophy and became a teacher at Wittenberg University. In 1517 he pinned his 95 theses to the door beginning his conflict with the medieval Catholic Church. Luther's resolve was to reform it but was unable to do so, declared a heretic in 1521. In the following years he formed the Lutheran Church. As well as an accomplished theologian and scholar, he was a prodigious preacher, wrote a translation of the bible and composed numerous hymns. He was the father of the Reformation, starting a movement that changed Europe and the world. He was also a complex man, a deep thinker with a fierce temper, ultimately used by God to promote the gospel of Jesus Christ.
