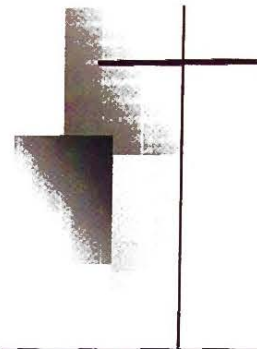

MOVING FORWARD, MOVING OUT

Today for the next few weeks we return to the gospel of Matthew. Having established Jesus' authority as the Son of God both as a teacher and saviour, the gospel moves onto the authority Jesus will pass onto the apostles. The word apostle literally, in Greek, means 'sent one'. These men, along with many others live and walked with Jesus and became his successors in a way as they kept up his mission proclaiming the gospel in word and deed. The story of Acts is a story of those first disciples going out into the world, bearing witness to Jesus, making even more disciples and so churches were planted and grew across the Roman Empire and beyond.

Many in modern mission are realising we have all but lost this early mission perspective of going out. We expect now that if we arrange the right kind of service whether liturgical, musical, miraculous or deep they will come flocking in as they always have. The reality we need to come to terms with for a multitude of reasons is that simply won't happen any more. Rather we need to be prayerfully looking at our families, our friendships, our relationships, our networks and our community and hope they will see in us Christ and chose to follow him.

Church Matters

As I mentioned in my AGM report, the Diocese requires parishioners who hold positions of responsibility within each parish to hold the required certification: Police Clearances, Working with Children Checks or Churchsafe Certificates.

If you are on the following list you are required to hold a Churchsafe Certificate: Parish Council, Synod reps, Prayer Group and Life Group leaders, Youth and Children's ministry workers, Music leaders and Welcomers. To obtain a Churchsafe Certificate one needs to complete a four and a half hour course. There are several proposed training courses planned for this year: Bull Creek on July 14, Shenton Park Aug 4, Kallaroo Sept 1, Palmyra Oct 21 and Bassendean Nov 3. You can book on line through the Diocesan Office for the course that best suits you.

When you have completed the course you will be given a certificate, a copy of which needs to be kept on file in the church office.
