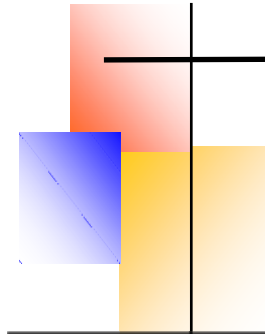

Living like Christ

What do most people nowadays want and expect from one another? We expect not much more than that people treat us kindly and respectfully. As we look at Colossians 2 and 3 we will see Paul move back and forth between what the Lord Jesus has done for us, the wonder of the cross, resurrection and ascension, and how we're to live. If you take the time to read and appreciate the ethics of the gospels and the apostles it is clear the Christian ethic is much more than our being kind and tolerant of one another, but nonetheless that's what it has been reduced to in the wider world and within the church. We have reduced love and grace to little more than live and let live.

Colossians reminds us of the fact that the Christian ethic is redemptive. In Christ we have been translated, spiritually teleported so to speak, from one world to another, from darkness to light, from bondage to freedom. We're also on a journey, the hope of heaven and Jesus' actions, past, present and future shape how we live. It means that people ought to see in the church people treating one another in a way that is astonishing and revolutionary. We live looking out for others over and above ourselves, we seek to live for God in a way that is truthful, godly, righteous. We're marked by selfless compassion and generosity and by fierce courage, purity and strength.

As we think about, pray for and hope for the renewal, revival and reinvigoration of the church as God's faithful people, we should pray we firstly capture the wonder of Christ anew, the importance of repentance and living faithfully day by day.
