

An Old Hope in a Newborn Baby

There is so much to the visit of the Magi to see the baby Jesus that captures our attention. We see it in their following an unexpected star, risking a perilous journey, bringing precious gifts and we marvel at the mystery surrounding their very identity about which we know so little. We can spend all of our energies on trying to understand who and what the magi were, whether wise men, kings or something else. For Matthew though their coming speaks to something much grander or worthier of our attention, the fulfilment of prophecy and promise.

In broad strokes, their arrival fulfils the promise made to Abraham that his descendants would be a light to the nations. Their arrival also reminds us of the visit of the Queen of Sheba who came to see the riches and the wisdom of Solomon and the hope of some Psalms such as Psalm 87 that the nations would come to gather to worship God in Israel. This was also a partial fulfilment of the hopes expressed in Isaiah that the nations would come to Zion bringing their gifts in the spirit of worship as the Magi come to worship the new-born king of Israel, the Messiah. In a day where much is made of multiculturalism, the Magi's visit to worship God speaks of the heart of an effective and meaningful gathering of the nations that are around Christ, bonded not by political correctness or legislation or mere curiosity but by faith and love and praise for him.
