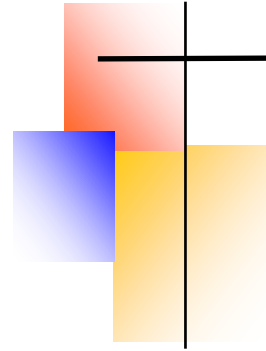

A Brave New World?

In the late sixties and early seventies a number of movies came out (many starring Charlton Heston) presenting dystopian views of the world's future (A dystopia is the opposite of a utopia, a society fallen apart). The cause varied from nuclear apocalypse, over-population, mad computers or man-made pandemics. In contrast Star Trek for example showed a future where we had united as a world and had travelled to the stars. The question of the world's future is like the question about the glass that is either half-empty or half-full.

Isaiah, like other parts of scripture point to both, to a time when it seems evil reigns supreme and God's people especially will face difficult days but it also looks forward to a time afterwards when evil, suffering and injustice will end. That process began with Jesus, inaugurated with his death and resurrection and will come to completion with Jesus' return. All of it though is a profound work of God, the gracious God whose plans and purposes are manifest in his Son Jesus, the God who brings both judgment and salvation depending on our response.
