

Old Church — New Life

8th October 2017

John Calvin

Born: 10 July 1509 Noyon, Picardy, France

Died: 27 May 1564 Geneva, Switzerland

Manner of death: A slow death after bursting a blood vessel in a lung.

Spouse: Idellette de Bure (A widow with two children, as well as their own son)

Significant Contribution: The Institutes of Religion; Commentaries on almost every book in the Bible.

John Calvin was born and grew up in France. He started to study Philosophy then Law. In his early twenties he was converted, corresponding with his break from the Catholic Church. He was influenced by Nicholas Cop and fled and joined him in Basel in Switzerland after Nicholas had been denounced as a heretic. He then wrote his first edition of the Institutes that were expanded upon again and again up to his death. William Farel convinced him to stay in Geneva where he ministered. After some time he proposed some reforms that were rejected and led to his expulsion. He then spent some time in Strasbourg then returned to Geneva at the council's request. Nonetheless the following years were difficult until his latter years when he enjoyed international respect as a reformer as influential as Martin Luther until his death.

He was one of the great systematic theologians of the church and a significant contributor to modern political thought.
